Other notable performers at trials included Alanna Bray-Lougheed (eighth in women's K-1 200m, sixth in women's K-1 500m), Cory Rublee (third in men's C-1 200m) and Aaron Rublee (fifth in men's C-1 200m).

The national team selections came on the heels of provincial trials earlier this month, when six Burloak athletes qualified for Ontario's Canada Games Team. Josh Havin, Jillian Perrone, Abigail Haines, Potts, Stott and Bray-Lougheed will represent Ontario at the Games.
