• Raitt and Luke Spano scored the goals against St. Andrew in the championship match of the North Oakville Invitational Tournament, St. John Paul II's second straight NOIT title.

The boys' and girls' indoor soccer team kept the tournament wins coming for St. John Paul II with a victory in the inaugural eight-team OSC Winter Champions League Cup last month.

St. John Paul II faced Halton Catholic and public schools, winning the championship 2-1 in penalty kicks following a scoreless draw with St. Joan of Arc. Co-captain Marko Cepo and Joshua Musulin scored the goals and netminder Francesco Caputi, another co-captain, made three saves in the shootout.
